The Legacy of Zeta Lives on in the Fairfax community of Virginia. Omicron Theta Zeta was chartered on March 24, 1991 on the campus of George Mason University by eleven sorors. In following the ideals of the international organization, Omicron Theta Zeta was established to serve the needs of the Northern Virginia Community.

Our chapter strives to create, implement and sustain programming and services in conjunction with other community service and advocacy organizations. Members consist of sorors from Virginia, Maryland, the District of Columbia, and Pennsylvania.

Omicron Theta Zeta Chapter Programs

Local projects include, but are not limited to: Omicron Theta Zeta Scholarship Foundation, breast cancer awareness, pre-maturity awareness, leadership development, Omicron Theta Zeta Stork's Nest, Walk America, NPHC Black Scholars Program, youth mentorship, and sponsorship of domestic violence victims and homeless families.

OTZ Scholarship Foundation

Since 2002, the Omicron Theta Zeta Scholarship Foundation, Inc. (OTZSF) has been committed to building stronger communities through education. OTZSF is a 501 (c) (3) non-profit scholarship arm of Omicron Theta Zeta chapter that has awarded thousands of dollars in scholarship awards to students to allow them to pursue their higher education. Our scholarship recipients have attended Hampton University, James Madison University, The University of Virginia, and the College of William and Mary, just to name a few.

Zeta Auxiliaries

- Stork's Nest: A partnership with the March of Dimes in an effort to encourage women to seek prenatal care within the first trimester of pregnancy, thereby increasing the prevention of birth defects and infant mortality.
